Wesley Wicker '79 Repays Debt to Theta Chi

s the vice president of advancement at Kennesaw State University and executive director of the KSU Foundation, Wesley Wicker '79 has seen the ins and outs of what makes an educational institution successful. With 22,500 students, KSU is the third-largest university in Georgia and has been sited as the fastestgrowing university in the country over the last 10 years.

Steering a department of 60 people at the University, Wesley reflects on the role that Theta Chi played in his leadership development. "I

never received better leadership training than as an officer in the Fraternity. I learned more in the Fraternity about interpersonal skills, team building, and simply getting along with people than I have in any job, work place, or professional association. For this I am deeply indebted to Theta Chi.

"We can never give back an equal amount to what the Fraternity did for us. It's simply a debt to which we can never fully repay. I challenge my fellow alumni to consider the success they have enjoyed in life and honestly say that the Fraternity had no role in the formulation of their values, ideals, and ethics. Theta Chi provided a firm foundation for us to become respectable citizens, successful professionals, and good family men."

For Wesley, repayment to Theta Chi has meant an investment in the capital campaign. "When I pledged

Alpha Phi Chapter in 1975, the house was only about 15 years old. It's now 50. Generations of brothers have come and gone, and there has been a great deal of wear and tear. A group of alumni gave us a new house in 1960. Those brothers who came before us built our house, and we are responsible for building for the next generation.

"Today's young men deserve our support. For the past five years, I have led the officers' retreat for the Chapter. It's been an insightful experience for me. The brothers are proud of our alumni and they

> want the alumni to be proud of them, too. Unlike in my generation, however, the house is now at a competitive disadvantage in recruitment and social image. I support the campaign because I want future Theta Chis to enjoy the benefits of an outstanding house, a house in which we can all have pride.

> "The Fraternity gave us all a sense of place—a place where we had pride in ourselves, where we had our personal successes, and shared accomplishments, a place where we all belonged. When I go back to our Chapter, I still feel that sense of place."
